What is Scientific about Data Science

Data is the new oil of the 21st century, and data science is the field that refines raw data into useful insights. Much like petroleum, data is a means to many ends, a valuable commodity, and a substance with potentially harmful side effects. Just because a field calls itself a science, and uses computer and statistical techniques, doesn't necessarily make it scientific. In this talk we'll explore the characteristics of science that make it a reliable source of knowledge and compare the philosophical and social aspects of science to data science workflows and algorithms to see what, if anything, is scientific about data science.

He majored in Science, Technology, and Society (Vassar '10), and earned a PhD in the Human and Social Dimensions of Science and Technology at Arizona State University.
