We are pleased to welcome you to MHPRC 2012, "*The Psychology of Sustainability*."

Registration for this event will be held from 10:00 am to 11:00 am on the morning of the 21st, and a continental breakfast will be served at that time. If you will be presenting at the Poster Session, please plan to arrive no later than 10:30 to ensure adequate time to set up your poster before the plenary session begins at 11:00 am. Paper Presenters:

If you are presenting a paper, you will have approximately 10 minutes to present your work and 5 minutes for audience questions. There will be 2 presentations given per breakout room. All presentation rooms will be equipped with a computer, a projector, and internet access.

Presenters should bring their presentation on a USB flash drive, and we also recommend that you email your final presentation to yourself the night before so that you can access it that way if you forget your flash. Often presenters also bring hand-outs to distribute, and these might be copies of the paper you have written, a brief compilation of highlights, or a slide hand-outs sheet such as can be created in PowerPoint. Finally, it is very helpful for presenters at all levels of experience to rehearse their presentation in front of a friendly audience of friends or family at least once before the actual event – we encourage you to try this out!
