Her recent book, Against the Tide: The battle for America's beaches, is on reserve in the library and on sale in the bookstore. The book is a fine example of how to write clear, informative journalistic prose. Ms. Dean also writes frequently, of course, for the New York Times Science section. The easiest way to find her articles is to visit http://archives.nytimes.com/archives on the web and use the site's search facility. You will be given references for her articles, which you can then locate in Vassar's library archives for the New York Times. I would also encourage you to spend some time with the Science section of the Tuesday New York Times, paying close attention to what you find there. Good editing is an essential component of good writing, and you will find many examples of it in the selection, organization, and writing in the articles you find in the Science Times.

Ms. Dean will be on campus on Thursday, September 28. Time and location of her master class and lecture will be publicized soon. In the meantime, I wish you all a successful start to your Vassar careers, and look forward to seeing you on the  $28^{\rm th}$ .
