Greenberg is the recipient of the James Beard Award for his *New York Times* bestseller *Four Fish: The Future of the Last Wild Food*. He is a regular contributor to *The New York Times Magazine*, Book Review, and Opinion Page, among other publications. Greenberg lectures widely on issues of ocean sustainability. He has lectured and reported extensively overseas with assignments in Russia, Ukraine, France, the Caucasus, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Serbia, the West Bank/Gaza, and many other locations around the world.
